Outdoor Partnership to fund FREE outdoor instructor training at the National Watersports Centre

The Outdoor Partnership is on the hunt for 10 people from across Gwynedd, Anglesey and Conwy to undertake a six week residential outdoor training programme being run at Plas Menai National Watersports Centre.

The course starts on Monday 23rd September and runs through to Friday 1st November. During the course, participants will develop their canoeing and kayaking skills, as well as gaining a number of qualifications required to become an outdoor instructor including First Aid and Foundation Safety and Rescue training.

Outdoor Partnership to fund FREE outdoor instructor training at the National Watersports Centre

Saturday September 7th saw MYC Rowing Porthmadog and more than 300 other fixed seat boats from all over the UK and Europe attend the Millwall slip, with 4 Celtic Longboats, to row the river Thames for 22 miles from London Docklands to Ham House near Richmond, Surrey.

All boats are handicapped, including Dragonboats, Skiffs, Irish Curragh's, Celtic Longboats, Seascouts, Pembroke's, Whalers, and many other traditional types, beginning the race on a handicapped basis.

Each MYC Rowing Porthmadog boat had a crew of 6, as a passenger was required at all times, and sported mandatory flags including Porthmadog, Jubilee and Welsh flags. 35 no. longboats from all over Wales attended with mens, ladies and mixed crews all lining up on the start line at 12:55.
